While he was here we met with the parish staff to strategize on the best way to maximize his time that he will be spending with us over the summer. We discussed a whole range of activities and Casey also expressed a desire to teach two classes over the summer. One will be a Bible Class with the focus on how to read the bible. As Bro. Casey said, "with 73 books and more than 1600 pages, actually sitting down to read the bible can be such an overwhelming task that many Catholics don't even know where to begin. In fact, many Catholics find the Bible overwhelming, confusing, and even boring." So on Wednesday nights from 7:30 to 9 PM Bro. Casey will use videos, pictures, activities, and even humor to give everyone who attends the class the confidence to read the Bible on a regular basis.

The second class Bro. Casey wants to offer he will do on Sunday afternoons at 3:30 to 5 PM and this one he is calling "Catholic Boot Camp". His goal is to teach an "everything you always should have known about Catholicism but were afraid to ask" class, covering the basics of the Bible, Catholic theology, liturgy and sacraments, spirituality and prayer, history, and social teaching in six weeks. It will be an ambitious project for him but he is excited about it because he feels our tradition has really failed over the years to evangelize and catechize our own people, and many adults honestly don't know their faith. He feels called to make the Catholic faith an interesting, engaging experience for everyone. I think I will be signing up for this class!! So mark your calendars for Bro. Casey's two classes.

Discover: Hierarchy of the Catholic Church

The highest authority belongs to the Bishop of Rome (the pope). He is also referred to as Peter's successor. Pope Francis was elected on March 13, 2013 by the College of Cardinals.

As successors of the Apostles, bishops shepherd and oversee a particular diocese. Bishop Paul S. Loverde is the bishop of the Diocese of Arlington in which Saint Francis of Assisi resides. An archbishop oversees a diocese, but also oversees a geographical region of dioceses. Cardinals are usually bishops who serve as advisors and have been appointed to the special role of electing a new pope. Priests share apostolic authority with a bishop and serve the bishop of their diocese and may work in a parish. A Monsignor is an honorary designation bestowed by the pope to a priest, who is then made a member of the "papal household" without additional authority. Deacons are ordained ministers who assist the diocesan bishop and priests in various tasks, including Baptism, distribution of Holy Communion and witnessing of Matrimony.

A religious order exists as communities of individuals who live their lives according to certain vows. reflecting a particular set of values. Religious orders have their own hierarchy. Fr. Kevin Downey, O.F.M. is the pastor of St. Francis of Assisi. Our Franciscan Friars are part of the Holy Name Province of the Order of Friars Minor (O.F.M.). Holy Name Province is shepherded by a Provincial Minister who interfaces with the local bishops and reports to the Minister General in Rome.



Next Saturday we will commission our new Stephen Ministers. These very loving people will begin in our Parish the gift of caring ministry to those in need. They have answered the call to follow in Jesus' caring footsteps. Please keep them in your prayers as they begin in their Pastoral Care.
