From the Pastor's Desk

Over the four years I have been here at St. Francis our parking lot on Sundays has been a source of frustration for everyone trying to get in or out of it. Because of this I am always looking for ways to alleviate this frustration. The "perfect storm" of congestion seems to hit around 11:45 AM on the Sundays when we have Religious Education. It is then when we have people leaving mass, parents picking up their children from Religious Education, and cars pulling into the parking lot for the noon mass. To alleviate this conception beginning on Sunday September 6th the noon mass will begin at 12:15 and the Hispanic mass will move from 1:30 to 1:45 PM. Moving the Noon mass up 15 minutes will hopefully allow the parking lot to clear out before people start pulling in. Members of the parish have suggested making this change to me and I think it is a good suggestion. My hope and prayer is that it helps!!!

Frank will help out in the parish but his main focus will be working as a Chaplain at a Diocesan Catholic School that has students from grades 6 to 12. To say I miss not having him here at the parish and up in the friary would be an understatement!! Right now the friars in our Province are all assigned and committed to their ministries. I am comfortable that with the help of Fr. John O'Connor and the parish staff I am able to meet the demands of the parish. Fr. John O'Connor while he is not assigned to the parish because he works for the Minister General in Rome he makes every effort to adjust his travel schedule so he can be available to the parish for which I am grateful. Fr. John Heffernan drives in from Maryland every weekend to minister to the needs of the Hispanic community and celebrate the 1:45 PM mass which is a huge help. So, all in all, while life is busy in the parish the work gets done and life is good.
