Foreclosure and bank accountability campaign victory: On May 31st, V.O.I.C.E. (Virginians Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement) clergy, lay leaders, and Senator Mark Warner gathered to celebrate their victories in holding major banks accountable for their role in the foreclosure crisis. Those victories include: \$1.67 million for non-profit housing counselors in Prince William County; 900+ families secured loan modifications; more than \$120+ million in principal and debt reduction through the National Mortgage Settlement; \$30+ million committed for neighborhood stabilization and affordable housing, as well as \$10 million to incentivize non-profit development; and \$8 million for VA Housing Trust Fund.
