From the Pastor's Desk

Pope Francis made a statement last week that received a lot of media attention and has caused confusion and concern for some people. Pope Francis said that in the upcoming Jubilee Year of Mercy he was going to grant to all priests the ability to forgive anyone who came to them and confessed that they had an abortion. I was also confused by the Pope's statement because for over the 33 years that I have been a priest and hearing confessions I have granted absolution to those who sought it for having had an abortion. I have also received this past week a couple of phone calls from people who had gone to confession in the past and were now concerned that even though they went to confession that they were still in a state of sin because the priest didn't have the ability then to forgive them of that sin. To clear up this confusion and to reassure those who have previously received absolution I contacted the Bishop's office for clarification. Here is a statement from Bishop Loverde addressing this issue and providing clarification:

"With all of the Catholic faithful, I welcome Pope Francis' message of mercy, which has been a consistent theme of his pontificate since its outset, and to which he will draw heightened attention during the upcoming Jubilee Year of Mercy. The announcement that Pope Francis is extending the faculty to absolve the sin of abortion to all priests throughout the world during the Jubilee Year of Mercy again illustrates his profound commitment to making God's mercy ever more available.

Within the Diocese of Arlington, both my predecessor Bishop Keating and I have given our priests the ability to forgive the sin of abortion. I also want to reassure those who have already celebrated the sacrament of Penance that their sins, including the sin of abortion, confessed with a contrite heart are forgiven forever. Let us rejoice with all who experience the mercy and peace of God through the forgiveness of sins in the sacrament of Penance!

While Confession offers the necessary spiritual healing to those involved with abortion because of the gravity of the sin, there is also need for post-abortive healing, often so that one can forgive oneself. Our parishioners volunteer through two, separate prison ministry programs. One supports imprisoned youth at the Woodbridge Juvenile Detention Center and the other supports adults through the Kairos program.

The **Juvenile Detention Center (JDC) ministry** is a witness to God's mercy. This ministry requires very little. Once a month we visit the Prince William County center for an hour of fellowship. We play games, work on craft projects and provide a positive message for their day. To hear their laughter and see how much they appreciate these little things is a great blessing. Kairos is a Christian ministry designed for use in male and female medium-to-maximum security prisons. Volunteers visit designated prisons twice per year, over three-day weekends, and facilitate an intentional, structured flow of events which encourage participants to encounter self, God and others from a spiritual perspective. Central to the Kairos Program are ongoing, participant-led prayer/share meetings and monthly reunions that include all Kairos graduates. There are many ways to become involved, including: prayer, baking cookies, writing letters, making donations and joining a weekend team. Kairos Asks for Your Support

The Kairos Program is a prison ministry, which involves screened volunteers visiting and interacting with those who are incarcerated. Its purpose is to build a Christian community internal to the prison. During October, two parishioners will visit Sussex I Correctional Center with one also visiting Greensville Correctional Center. You can assist our Kairos representatives in the following manner:

- 1. **Prayer**. Intercessory prayer is powerful—for those incarcerated as well as their families. Kairos asks for prayers that will be displayed in one of two methods: a prayer chain (i.e., a paper representation depicting people who have prayed/will be praying for those going through the Kairos weekend: and a praver wheel (i.e., a clock depiction of 30-minute time slots spanning the Kairos weekend). Both visuals project the intensity of love.
- 2. **Cookies**. Each volunteer is responsible for bringing 100 dozen cookies-a metaphor for abundant love. These cookies are given to those involved in the Kairos Weekend as well as all the prisoners in each correctional center. As one released prisoner said, "There's a whole world in a dozen cookies."

After each Mass over the weekend of September 12th-13th. there will be a table for individuals to sign-up for prayers/ pick-up recipes for making cookies since the prison environment has many restrictions. You can deliver cookies to the parish office up to Monday, September <u>28, 2015</u>.
