From the Pastor's Desk

From the Franciscans of Holy Name Province Office of Justice and Peace, I received this letter written by Bishop Oscar Cantú, and I was asked to share it with everyone in the parish. Here is the letter:

As Chair of the Committee on International Justice and Peace of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, I welcome the momentous agreement just reached between the United States and its P5+1 partners with Iran. This significant achievement aims to curb Iran's development of nuclear weapons while allowing them to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes. More importantly, this agreement signals progress in global nuclear non-proliferation. In January 2015, Pope Francis said, "I express my hope that a definitive agreement may soon be reached between Iran and the P5+1 Group regarding the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, and my appreciation of the efforts already made in this regard."

Since 2007, our Committee on International Justice and Peace, reflecting the longstanding position of the Holy See, has urged our nation to pursue diplomacy to ensure Iran's compliance with its obligations under the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. For years, we have supported dialogue and a negotiated resolution of the conflict in collaboration with international partners.

It is no small achievement that the United States, the United Kingdom, the Russian Federation, China, Germany and France have reached this agreement with Iran. We hope that the full implementation of the agreement will gradually foster an environment in which all parties build mutual confidence and trust, so that progress will be made toward greater stability and dialogue in the region. In that spirit, our Committee will continue to urge Congress to endorse the result of these intense negotiations because the alternative leads toward armed conflict, an outcome of profound concern to the Church.

The United States and its international partners have taken a remarkable step with Iran in reaching this agreement. We encourage Congress to support these efforts to build bridges that foster peace and greater understanding. In the words of Pope Francis, may the negotiated framework "be a definitive step toward a more secure and fraternal world," a goal we all share.

Ways to SHARE Your Faith

As baptized Christians, we are commissioned to evangelize. How can we engage people in a lifetransforming relationship with Jesus Christ and pass on the Catholic faith from generation to generation?

To make the greatest impact, we model the Catholic faith by expressing and practicing it in everyday life. At home, we can connect faith with routines, such as: praying at mealtime; displaying religious objects; engaging in caring conversations; serving those in need; celebrating Mass and religious traditions; praying when we wake up and when we go to sleep; and reading the Bible alone and with others. At work, we can: be an example of a hard worker; develop and cultivate friendships; be joyful and fun to work with; talk about our families, including the ways we practice our faith; ask others about their faith; call or visit them when they are ill or have experienced a loss in their life; and ask them to come with us to Sunday Mass.

We can also take a leap and become involved in parish activities that reach out to others. Very active programs and committees address a variety of needs in our local area. V.O.I.C.E., the Anti-Human Trafficking Committee, Respect life Committee and Care for Creation Committee are successful examples of parishioners assisting neighbors. Likewise, volunteering with St. Francis House or meals for the homeless directly impacts the lives of many people living in the surrounding area. Another option is to join an organization like Knights of Columbus, Columbiettes, Ancient Order of Hibernians or Secular Franciscans who practice evangelization through service.
