From the Pastor's Desk

I have great memories of my grandfather. He was a man of integrity. He was a dairy farmer who loved his family and passed down simple yet important life lessons. My dad told me a story that when he was young Grandpa asked him to give him a hand in washing down some borrowed farm equipment before they returned it to a neighbor. My dad asked him, "Why are we cleaning this? It was dirty when we got it." My grandfather's response to my dad was "that you should always return something a little better than you found it".

Years later and a week after Grandpa's funeral, I helped my dad vacuum, wash, and refuel a car he had borrowed from a friend. After returning the car. my dad's friend said to me. "Whenever I loan something to your dad. I know whatever I lend him will come back in even better shape."

And that is my grandpa's legacy. He left the world just a little better than he found it. I hope I can do the same.

A father instills in his son the importance of respect and generosity, and then his son instilled those same lessons in his son. That same legacy of love is the legacy of Jesus Christ to us. Our very identity as Disciples of Christ is centered in such complete and constant love; our faithfulness in imitating the compassion and forgiveness of Christ is lived in our openness of heart and spirit to love selflessly, completely and unconditionally, as God has loved us in Christ. Jesus the Healer and Reconciler, Jesus the Footwasher. Jesus the Crucified, entrusts to us his Disciples a "new" standard and understanding of love: a love that places others first and the common good before our own, a love that renews and re-creates all human relationships, a love that transforms the most godless and secular world view into the compassion and justice of God. The challenge for us as Disciples of Christ in our world today is to keep this legacy of love alive and to pass it on.
