From the Pastor's Desk

For us to become Disciples of Christ we need to mature and develop the characteristics of Jesus Christ but unfortunately for many of us we grow older but we never grow up. We are stuck in perpetual "spiritual infancy". The reason why we are stuck is because we never made a decision to grow up. Spiritual growth is not automatic. It takes an intentional decision and a commitment. You have to want to grow, you have to decide to grow, you have to make an effort to grow, and you have to persist in growing. Discipleship—the process of becoming like Christ—always begins with a decision.

Jesus calls us, and then we need to decide if we are going to respond to His invitation or not. "Come, be My disciple", Jesus said to Matthew. So Matthew got up and followed Him. When Matthew and the first disciples chose to follow Jesus, they didn't realize or understand all the implications of their decision. They simply decided to accept Jesus' invitation. That is what we need to do to get started in becoming a Disciple of Christ. We need to decide to become a disciple—to answer His call and then be committed to what it will demand of us.

My spiritual director years ago said to me that nothing shapes your life more than the commitments you choose to make. Our commitments can develop us or they can destroy us, but either way, they will define us. He said to me: "tell me what you are committed to, and I'll tell you what you will be in twenty years". We become whatever we are committed to.

To become a Disciple of Christ requires us to make a decision and a commitment. Many of us are afraid to commit to anything and just drift through life. Others make halfhearted commitments to competing values, which leads to frustration and mediocrity. Others make a full commitment to worldly goals, such as becoming wealthy or famous, and end up disappointed and bitter. Every decision we make has consequences not only here-and-now but eternally, so we need to decide wisely.

Becoming a Disciple of Christ is the result of making a decision and then making "Christ-like" choices. Once we decide to get serious about becoming a Disciple then we will need to begin to act in new ways. We will need to let go of some old routines, develop some new habits, and intentionally change the way we think. We can be certain that the Holy Spirit will help us make these changes for our spiritual growth is always a collaborative effort between us and the Holy Spirit. So we need to ask ourselves: Have I decided to become a Disciple of Jesus Christ? Will I make this commitment? My hope and prayer is that everyone in the parish will say YES and be committed to pursue this goal. As a parish of committed Disciples we will truly make a difference in our world!!

A New Author in the Parish


What if I told you that superheroes were real?
