#### **Counting Our Blessings**

St. Francis of Assisi Church, volunteers twice a year at the Hilda Barg Shelter providing meals. Last week with the help of the Finance Council, Parish Council, The Knights of Columbus, Stephen Ministry, Spanish Prayer Group, the women's Corner Stone Group, and the Girl Scout Group we provided dinners for almost 30 people for the entire week.

When I go to serve at the shelter, I love to sit down and have dinner with the residents at the shelter. I like to get to know them better. This time, I had the blessing to have dinner with three children ages 10, 11, and 14 years old. We talked about school, about their friends, and I always ask them what they would like us to prepare for dinner. They got very excited and told me that they love tacos; they gave me all the details of how they wanted the tacos. It was a long and happy conversation, it never came out that they were homeless, or that they did not have a place to call home, especially during the Holidays.

Later that night, when I got home and saw my kids were peaceful sleeping in their warm beds. In that moment, I prayed to God and gave him thanks for all of the blessings in my life. For my family, my health, my job, the volunteers at church, and for giving me the chance to give my family a place to call home. Every family has their challenges, their own struggles; family financial situations are out of a child's control. With this in mind, it is crucial to never allow such issues to be an obstacle in the way of a child's opportunities.

Even with so little, these children that I had served made me smile. In this way, we all have the ability to give to one another. Please remember to reflect upon your blessings, however big or small they may be, and remember to give a smile, give a hug, and say a little prayer.



Follow Me: Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John


