

Below are statements from Bishop Burbidge and the leadership of the Franciscan (O.F.M) friars in the United State concerning the recent decision to rescind DACA. We friars echo the words of Bishop Burbidge. We are disheartened by the news of this decision by President Trump.

St. Francis friars:

Ours is a nation of immigrants and has been since its founding. It is especially disappointing that children who were brought here by their parents and obviously had no say in the decision, may now be penalized. They could potentially be sent back to countries that for them are foreign lands.

The time has come for the leadership of our country to move beyond partisan differences and pass effective immigration reform legislation.

As I look out from the altar on Sundays, I see people from every race, from counties all over the world. It is a beautiful sight!

It is who we are as a nation, and with the correct moral leadership, who we will be in the future.

Bishop Michael F. Burbidge:

I join my voice with those who are disheartened by the news that President Trump will rescind DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). Standing with my brother Bishops, I urge Congress and the President to enact legislation that will safeguard those currently protected by this important program.

While the issue of immigration is complicated—and our government has many consideration to balance in responding to the influx of those who seek safety, and personal and economic security in our country—offering special protection to those who only know the United States as home is a reasonable measure of compassion.

This news is undoubtedly troubling for the hundreds of thousands approved through DACA. I ask all Catholics and people of good will in the Diocese Arlington to keep these individuals, as well as our government officials, in prayer. May we as a country be considerate of our neighbors and defend those whom we have offered protection and safe harbor.

US Franciscan Statement:

As leaders and members of the Franciscan Order in the United States, we object in strenuous terms to the decision to rescind the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). This decision constitutes a rejection of the 2012 executive order by President Barack Obama that allowed young immigrants, who were brought to the United States by their parents, to seek the opportunity to realize their full potential. President Obama's executive order was not only moral, it also responded to the highest ideals of our nation.

The 780,000 "dreamers" (those who have received deferred action) are good, generous, talented and hard-working individuals. Many of them we know personally in and through various Franciscan ministers. We have celebrated the DACA program with them as a modern response to the Biblical imperative to "welcome the stranger."

We call upon all to contact their members of Congress and urge them to pass legislation that will fully welcome "dreamers" to our nation, remove the permanent shadow of their temporary status and make it illegal to deport or harm them. We join the U.S. Catholic Bishops in advocating for the bi-partisan "Dream Act of 2017", H.R.3440 and S. 1615. This legislation can help "dreamers" receive a piece of the security and human dignity they and all people deserve.

Were you married in 1967 or 1992?





- Check your wine cellar for overstock for our Wine Wheel. Boxes will be in the church foyer for wine drop off the weekends of 9/23-9/24 and 9/30-10/1, as well as the weekend of the festival.
- Gently used, clean stuffed animals needed for our game prize booth. Please drop off donations in church foyer, clearly marked for Francis Fest the same weekends as mentioned above for wine donations.
- Cakes/baked goods for our cake wheel should be dropped off in the school foyer the morning of the festival. Both the cake and wine wheel are two very popular events which help to offset the cost of the festival.
- Volunteer to help for a shift at the festival. We need set-up and clean-up crews as well as assistance for the various activities during the festival. Volunteer sign-up is simple and is done completely online. Look for detailed instructions in a separate bulletin announcement.

Pre-sale tickets are 6/\$5. The day of the festival tickets will be \$1 each. All events, food and drink at the festival are charged by the ticket, so plan to buy ahead and take advantage of the discount.
