
Lots of assistance from parish members is needed to make the festival the great success it has been in past years. Here is what you can do to help:

- Check your wine cellar for overstock for our Wine Wheel. Boxes will be in the church fover for wine drop off the weekends of 9/23-9/24 and 9/30-10/1, as well as the weekend of the festival.
- Gently used, clean stuffed animals needed for our game prize booth. Please drop off donations in church fover. *clearly marked for Francis Fest* the same weekends as mentioned above for wine donations.
- Cakes/baked goods for our cake wheel should be dropped off in the school fover the morning of the festival. Both the cake and wine wheel are two very popular events which help to offset the cost of the festival.
