Please see below the summary of the meeting our parish leaders had with Bishop Burbidge. It was a Listening Session concerning the current sexual abuse crisis in the Church. Our representatives said it was a very positive experience. It should be noted only lay leaders of parishes, no clergy, were invited to participate.

-Session started on time and was well run with a facilitator establishing ground rules (2 minutes speaking time; respect for speakers; no hidden / off topic agendas, etc.).

-In addition to the victims, the "people in the pews" deserve an apology. Bishop Burbidge agreed.

-The Diocese of Arlington is an independent unit; its resources cannot be tapped for other diocese's liabilities or by the Vatican for liabilities.

-The Diocese of Arlington has insurance coverage for sexual misconduct; the coverage is on a claims made basis (versus occurrence basis), has high excess limits, and has "tail" coverage for past acts.

-Post-2002 Dallas Charter, all allegations are turned over to authorities and investigated, even if the victim/family does not want to make a scene.

-Diocese of Arlington already began the review of files before the recent announcement by the Virginia Attorney General of its investigation; this is essentially the third review.

-Reforms post-2002 Dallas Charter appear to be working; incidence is down.

-When allegations are made, priests are administratively removed from ministry pending results of investigation.

-Past problems are partly attributable to seminaries doing a poor job of "human formation" versus "spiritual formation" etc.; Pope John Paul II emphasized that "human formation" comes first.

-Diocese has 45 men in formation; Bishop Burbidge has open and frank discussions about sexual abuse with them; Bishop Burbidge wants to hear directly from them if there are concerns.

-Perpetrators deserve our forgiveness (per parishioner from other parish); Bishop Burbidge agrees; it is the Gospel message, even though tough in this circumstance.

-Priests with credible accusations are either laicized (Vatican has made the process easier) or live out their priesthood in prayer and penance.

-The Virginia list of priests with credible accusations will include deceased priests; sometimes victims will not step forward until seeing priest publicly accused.
