When a highway has been improved one often sees a sign that says, "Your tax dollars at work!"

Below is a description of your "collection dollars" at work!

Our parking lots and driveways had a number of cracks in the pavement, as well as

several potholes. We had the cracks and potholes repaired, with some additional work to be done. The entire asphalt surface was resealed, which will extend the lifespan of the pavement.

Additionally we repaired sections of the concrete sidewalks at the entrance to the Parish Offices and at the walkways between the Church and Parish Center.

One consequence of this work is that you will no longer have to walk through "puddles" when going from the Church to the Parish Center.

We replaced the air conditioning units for the office wing, and were able to make adjustments to the air conditioning system for the Parish Center, and the Church. This will extend the life of those units.

The floors of the Parish Center were cleaned and waxed, and several of the walls were painted. The Gym floor also received its yearly sanding and recoating.

Deferred maintenance is the "bane" of any institution, and it is my policy not to defer maintenance, if at all possible.

What was done this summer will save us tens of thousands of dollars in the long run.

What does the Church Teach?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin.... Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens". Not every individual American is prosperous, but our nation is indeed among the most prosperous in the world, and so we are called not to keep our blessings to ourselves, but to share our goods with our brothers and sisters.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

"The Catholic Church in the United States is an immigrant Church with a long history of embracing diverse newcomers and providing assistance and pastoral care to immigrants, migrants, refugees, and people on the move. Our Church has responded to Christ's call for us to 'welcome the stranger among us', for in this encounter with the immigrant, the migrant, and the refugee in our midst, we encounter Christ."


