Immigration and the Catholic Response

Immigration and Human Impact

There are more than 11 million undocumented immigrants presently in the United States. Each year, approximately 300,000 more enter the country. Yet there are only 55,000 green cards available annually in the lottery, known as the Diversity Visa program. With few exceptions, these immigrants are hardworking, honest, faithful people simply desiring the opportunity to make a better life for themselves and their families. The United States is a nation of immigrants; a review of the history of our own families and of our nation reminds us of the need to welcome the stranger in our midst.

Excerpts from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

Why Don't They Come Here Legally? ... If our ancestors did it, why can't they?

Many of our ancestors didn't actually come here through federal "legal" channels—there weren't restrictive federal immigration laws in place at the time

Until the 1870's, the federal government did virtually nothing to restrict immigration to the United States... In 1882, Congress promulgated the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, restricting immigration of Chinese laborers... In 1921, beginning with the Emergency Quota Act, the United States began to restrict immigration through the use of national origins quotas... In 1965, amendments to the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952 abolished the quota system, prioritizing instead familybased immigration.

Under current laws, no "line" for lawful immigration to the United States actually exists for the majority of our immigrants.

U.S. immigration laws provide three core means by which an immigrant may obtain lawful permanent residency.

First, a qualified family member in the United States may petition to bring a foreign-born family member to the country lawfully... However, there are numeric limitations on most of these family-based categories, resulting in backlogs for entry that often range anywhere from **five years to nearly 20 years**.

Second, immigrants fleeing political persecution or a well-founded fear of future persecution... may seek political asylum in the United States or qualify for refugee status... Even if they do qualify... there is an annual cap on the number of refugee admissions to the United States, which is set annually and is typically between **70,000 and 80,000**.

Third, here are various immigration categories for workers to be sponsored by a U.S.-based employer to come to the United States... However, these categories are limited to multinational executives and professors; those with advance degrees ... and narrowly-defined, specialized workers. Today's unauthorized immigrants are largely low-skilled workers who come to the United States for work to support their families.

The Kairos Program is a prison ministry, which involves screened volunteers visiting and interacting with those who are incarcerated. Its purpose is to build a Christian community within a prison. From **September 19th-22nd**, John Cipparone will support the Kairos weekend at State Farm Correctional Center. You can assist him in two ways:

- Sign-up for Prayer Chain: Intercessory prayer is powerful for those incarcerated as well as their families. A Prayer Chain is a visible way of showing offenders that people are praying for them. It is done by linking paper strips with people's names who pray, for any amount of time, for them during this weekend. You can sign-up after Masses on the last weekend in August and the first weekend in September. Recent Top Facts about Human Trafficking MSN.com, July 25, 2019

- Human trafficking is the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act.
- Trafficking individuals was not illegal in the US until the year 2000.
- The US, Mexico and Philippines are the top three countries for human trafficking.
- The US National Human Trafficking hotline receives 150 calls a day - more than 49,000 since 2007.
- Virginia is ranked 15th in the nation in terms of the greatest number of human trafficking cases.
- 18,000 to 20,000 people are trafficked in the U.S. each year - with 1 in 7 being men/boys.
- Over 70% of individuals trafficked as laborers enter the U.S. legally.
- When individuals are trafficked to work in industry, they are more often put to work as Domestic Servants or in Agriculture.
- In agriculture, trafficked victims work in the tobacco and cattle industries.
- In 2018, the Department of Justice doubled its antihuman trafficking budget to \$31 million.
- Human Trafficking is Slavery.
- Many trafficked victims do not think they are a victim... but are stuck in their situation due to economic hardship, psychological pressure, impact of natural disasters or political instability. Do you like to sing? The St. Francis Music Ministry welcomes singers of ALL ages. Rehearsals begin AUGUST 26th




Sometimes we sit listening to the choirs and wish we were singing with them. Now is your chance! Come check out
