Thank you again to all who have continued to generously support your parish. We are holding our own as regards to parish finances and the donations of food for Francis House has been exceptional.

We have submitted an application to the Government for a "small business" loan

which we will need if the shut-down continues through June. We have yet to hear if we have been approved.

As you may have read in the papers, part of the delay in approving loans and grants, is because the larger banks are overwhelmed with applications. A couple of parishes in the rural areas of the diocese have already received approval but that is due to the fact that they have their accounts with small country banks.

It has also not helped that several large corporations have received funds that were supposed to be directed to small businesses. Hopefully that is being corrected.

The Parish Office continues to operate with limited staff and our Parish School, through the extraordinary efforts of Dr. Barber and faculty, continues to develop a variety of ways to maintain classes with our students.

The Church continues to be open for several hours each day. As was announced, we had to change the time of Saturday Confessions to 3:00 p.m. (3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.). This is due to the need to begin the set-up for the Live Streaming of the weekend Mass.

So all in all, we are hanging in, and like you praying and hoping that life can get back to normal in the not too distant future.

You continue to be in our thoughts and prayers.

A fresh perspective on the Sunday Readings HIS WORD TODAY By Rev. William J. Reilly



"Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, 'What are we to do, my brothers?' Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

It is exciting to read the sermons of Peter and Paul in the Acts of the Apostles. They call our attention to the fundamental teaching of Jesus' dying and rising for the love of us. When was the last time the words of a preacher, a spiritual book or magazine, or a conversation with a friend or teacher led you to ask 'What am I to do?'

If I follow the teaching of Peter, I will become more aware of the gift of the promised Spirit to form and transform my life. We are told not to stifle the Spirit, yet sometimes we do a good job at it. We have been baptized, but can always do more in the area of repentance. What am I going to do?

There is a book located in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel next to the Tabernacle for you to write your own prayers of petition. During the <u>Prayer of the Faithful</u> during



weekend liturgies, an intercession will call to mind those prayers in a general way. In this manner, the public prayer of the church is bound to the many prayers of the faithful who live in the body of Christ!


