
Sessions will be conducted by phone until further notice due to COVID-19.

Residing and providing therapy services in Michigan for 15 years, he ran a Catholic private practice for a few years and in 2006, joined a CMH (Community Mental Health) agency for 12 years providing individual therapy and crisis intervention for both



adults and youth; treating those affected with depression, anxiety, obsessive compulsive disorder and scrupulosity; trauma; anger; behavioral issues; substance use; and couple/marital issues. He has provided group therapy for those with personality disorders (DBT), substance use disorders (IOP) and Anger Management groups.






"Having come down in a cloud, the Lord stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, 'Lord.' Thus the Lord passed before him and cried out, 'The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.' Moses then bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, 'If I find favor with you O Lord, do come along in our company.'"

How exciting is the description of Moses' encounter with God. He reveals His name and we discover the attributes of God—mercy, graciousness, kindly and faithful. It is no surprise that there is an invitation to accompany his people on their journey.
