A fresh perspective on the Sunday Readings

HIS WORD TODAY

By Rev. William J. Reilly



"Thus says the Lord: Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows, and bread to the one who eats. so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth, my word shall not return to me void...achieving the end for which I sent it."

As our own gardens are bursting with colorful flowers and the vegetable plants continue to grow, the image of the seed, fertility and fruitfulness are so appropriate.

The prophet Isaiah, writing six centuries before the Christian era, used the same example as the parable of the seed, but also the need for water, warmth and care for the word to achieve its purpose.

We listen to the Word of God, we open the text and reflect upon it, we are so familiar with what is written and read. A more important step must be taken. The rain and snow must penetrate the earth to provide the necessary support for growth. The water cannot just run off as often happens with the sudden summer downpour.

A soft, penetrating shower offers the condition necessary to accomplish its end. So too, does reflection upon the word, weighing and pondering its meaning for me today. May my listening heart allow that growth to take place

<u>V</u>irginians <u>Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement</u>

<u>Founded in 2008</u>, VOICE is a nonpartisan, nonprofit coalition of almost 50 faith and civic organizations in Northern Virginia - including Catholic and other Christian, Jewish, and Muslim congregations - that believe people working together have the power to transform lives and strengthen communities. St Francis of Assisi has been an active and committed member of VOICE since its founding.

Catholics are called to put the *Two Feet of Love* in Action! This foundational metaphor describes two distinct, but complementary, ways we can put the Gospel in action in response to God's love: *charitable works* (short-term, emergency assistance for individuals) and *social justice* (addressing systemic, root causes of problems that affect many people). To walk with Jesus in this world we need to use both of our feet. In our parish, Francis House helps serve the first, and VOICE helps serve the second. Fr John O'Connor and Fr Iggy were active participants in VOICE Clergy meetings with Governor Northam addressing the types of issues described below.

Some of VOICE's accomplishments impacting Prince William County

June 2019 – June 2020

- On-going /Current top priority: Campaign to stop evictions: The bias baked into our housing sector and our economy at large already contributes to people of color being disproportionately and severely rent-burdened. Now, the disparate effects of the Covid-19 virus and job and income loss due to the pandemic are putting them in a vise that leaves them at risk of eviction. Between 600,000 and 1 million renters in Virginia are expected to have trouble paying their rent. VOICE is working with the Governor, the Commonwealth Attorney, and other like-minded groups on two fronts: 1. Target State CARES Act money for rent relief, and 2. VOICE joined with the Attorney General in appealing to General District Court judges to extend a moratorium on eviction proceedings long enough to allow the Governor's rent relief program to be implemented.
- <u>Establishment of a State funded Public Defenders office</u>: PWC is the second-largest jurisdiction in Virginia, is majority minority, and was the only jurisdiction in Northern Virginia without a Public Defender's Office. Prior to establishment of the Public Defenders Office, PWC relied solely upon low-paid court appointed counsel to provide representation to indigent defendants, a system rife with serious flaws.
- Virginians no longer have their driver's licenses suspended due to failure to pay court fines and fees: VOICE helped spearhead a campaign to eliminate Virginia's draconian practice of suspending driver's licenses for unpaid court debt. In 2019, 627,000 Virginians were denied the right to drive to work, pick up their children from school, or take an elderly parent to a doctor's appointment, simply because, being poor, they were unable to pay their court debt.
- St Francis VOICE "in-house" Accomplishments: Because of the efforts of the St. Francis VOICE team, in cooperation with other local organizations, as of July 1st, our immigrant community at St. Francis will no longer live under the fear of 287(g). The 287(g) agreement between the PWADC (jail) and ICE has been in place since 2010. The retiring PWC Chief of Police had long urged the elimination of this agreement declaring it an impairment to police community relations. Only one other county in Virginia has such an agreement. ICE-trained correctional officers screened incoming detainees to determine immigration status, and, if undocumented, hold the detainee for ICE agents to pick up for deportation. Local attorneys have long cited cases involving the 287(g) as lacking in due process and vulnerable to racial profiling.


