From the Friars

Dear parishioners,

Because of the Coronavirus, a number of people especially in the lower income class have not been able to pay their rents.

Up until now landlords have deferred those rent payments, but that is now changing and families are facing eviction.

We are doing what we can to help families in this area through our Francis House Financial aid program, but it is no where near enough.

The organization of Virginia churches, VOICE has been lobbying the governor's office to help with this challenge.

Below you can find a request for your help through a letter writing campaign.

There is currently a program to help renters, but most renters do not know about it, or cannot get through on the phone in time to avoid their eviction date. They have found that over half of renters are "self-evicting" to avoid a court hearing on the eviction. It is an extremely dire situation, especially with the fact that kids may be experiencing homelessness while doing distance learning in the fall. Please consider going to the link below to send a letter to the governor. Also, please forward the link to others who may be interested in signing the letter.

Dear Parishioners,



I am writing to update you on how things are going here in the parish. To begin, my sincere appreciation for your continuing support for the parish during these difficult times. Your weekend collection donations, your donations of food and money for Francis House, have enabled our parish to continue to function and to be of special service to the most needy.

Having said that, I am concerned that there has been a drop in the weekend collection recently. As you are aware, we rely on the weekend collections to pay our operating expenses. I know that you have much on your mind as you and your families continue to do your best to meet the challenges of the current crisis. I ask that you please continue to keep the needs of our parish in mind.

We of course are all looking forward to that day when we will again see some sense of normalcy.

The weekend on site Masses are going well. Folks who have been at other parishes for Mass have complimented us on the high standard of safeguards that we have put in place to protect those attending the Masses. We currently have three on site Masses, two in English and one in Spanish. If we see a need for additional Masses, we will add a 5:30 pm. on Sunday evening.

The live stream Mass on Saturday evening will continue indefinitely. We are looking into purchasing mobile equipment for live streaming. This would enable us to also offer the Saturday evening Mass as an "on site" Mass. Of course, all of this planning will be dependent on the activity of the virus.

The replacement of the HVAC (heating and air conditioning) system in the Parish Center is now scheduled for early Fall. The delay is caused by factory shutdowns caused by the pandemic. In the meantime, we will lease a temporary HVAC system.

We are planning to open our parish school for "on site" instruction this Fall. We are able to do this because we have a comparatively small student population and extensive facilities. This combination makes it possible to put stringent social distancing measures in place; something that unfortunately most public schools are not able to do. We will closely monitor any developments with the virus and make any necessary adjustments.

Congratulations to our young parishioners who will be making their Confirmation and First Communion next month. These sacraments were postponed from the Spring because of the virus.

We will be presenting a series of Adult Education programs on Zoom in the next few weeks. Details will be posted on the website. We are also looking for ways to communicate with the Members of our parish who do not have access to a computer.

Finally, our thanks to Brother John Neuffer, a friar in formation, who has been with us these past two months. John has been very helpful working at Francis House and at the weekend Masses. We wish him the best as he returns to studies in Chicago.

Please know that all parishioners continue to be in the prayers of the friars. May God continue to bless you.



HIS WORD TODAY

"Jesus said to his disciples: The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again and out of joy goes and sells all he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price he goes and sells all he has and buys it."

At this time of the year it is not rare late in the day to find a person on the beach, moving from left to right, with a metal detector, listening for a sound to reveal a coin, or other valuable, beneath the sand. I often wonder if something of value surfaces.

Jesus tells us what the treasure is, what the pearl of great price is, but how do I react? Does it move me, to put other things aside, to move below the surface and discover how blessed I am? We might hear the detector signal us, but we must bend, sift and reach out to discover what is really important for our spiritual lives. The treasure and the pearl are the life of grace, the gift of God's life, accepted by me, and shared with others.

What are the treasure and pearl for me today?

The Grace of God is a Great Treasure.


