**Social Justice: Franciscan Action and Advocacy (FA&A)**

The next **Prescription Drug Take-Back Day** is here! On **Saturday, April 30th**, the Prince William County Police Department and the Manassas City Police Department will join with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) to provide a safe and legal way to dispose of unused or expired prescription medications. Simply bring them to the collection sites at **Novant Health Prince William Medical Center, Sentara Lake Ridge, or Novant Health Haymarket Medical Center** from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. This nationwide prescription drug "Take-Back" initiative seeks to prevent pill abuse and theft. According to the DEA, rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are increasing at alarming rates.

- Unused or expired prescription medications are a public -safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose, and abuse.
- Pharmaceutical drugs can be just as dangerous as street drugs when taken without a prescription or a doctor's supervision.
- The majority of those abusing prescription drugs, including teens, get them from family and friends – and the home medicine cabinet.
- Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused, or illegally sold.
- Unused drugs that are flushed contaminate the water supply. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.
- **Take-back programs are the best way to dispose of old drugs.** But if a program is not available, do NOT flush them down the toilet! Instead:
  - ◇ Take the meds out of their bottles;
  - ◇ Mix them with something unappealing like used kitty litter or coffee grounds;
  - ◇ Seal them in a bag or disposable container, and throw that away.

During this initiative, prescription and over-the-counter solid -dosage medications (i.e., tablets and capsules) will be accepted. Intravenous solutions, injectables, and needles will not be accepted. Illicit substances, such as marijuana or methamphetamine will also not be accepted. **For more information, please call the Crime Prevention Unit at 703-792-7270.**

Note: On **April 30th**, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m., **Stafford Hospital** (101 Hospital Center Blvd., Stafford) will also be participating in the Drug Take-Back Day.
