From the Pastor's Desk

A young man dreamed of being an actor, but in the early 1980s, he wasn't getting the big parts he wanted. Broke and discouraged, he drove his beat-up old car to the top of the hill overlooking the city of Los Angeles and did something unusual. He wrote himself a check for ten million dollars for "acting services rendered".

This young man had grown up so poor his family lived in a Volkswagen van at one time. He put that check in his wallet and kept it there. When things got tough, he would pull it out and look at it to remind himself of his dream. A dozen years later, that same young man, the comedian Jim Carrey, was making fifteen million to twenty-five million a movie.

Studies tell us that we move toward what we consistently see. That we should keep something in front of us, even if it's symbolic, to remind us of what we are striving for. Every time we see it, we are moving toward our goal. It reminds us of what we are dreaming about. Proverbs say, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." With no vision you will get stuck. That's why many people have lost their passion. They don't have anything that reminds them of what they are dreaming about.

I believe that this can be true for our parish as well. Just as we as individuals need goals and a vision to strive for so do we as a parish. Our vision as a parish is to be a community of "dynamic disciples" that is known for our passion for serving God in the spirit of St. Francis. Each and every one of us has been called to be a Disciple of Jesus Christ. To help remind us of this goal and to keep this vision in front of us we have hung banners over the entrances into our church that state: **CALLED TO BE DISCIPLES**. Every time we see these banners may they inspire us to achieve this vision.

It is important for us as a parish to keep this vision in front of us. In the Old Testament God promised Abraham that he would be the father of many nations. But God didn't just give him the promise; God gave him a vision. God said, "Abraham, go out and look at the stars—that is how many descendants you will have." Why did God give him a vision? God knew there would be times when it would look as if the promise would not come to pass, and Abraham would be discouraged and tempted to give up. In those times, Abraham would go out at night and look up at the sky. When he saw the stars, faith would rise in his heart.

Like Abraham, there will be times when it seems as if our dream of becoming a community of dynamic Disciples of Jesus Christ is not coming to pass. Like Abraham we will have to go back to our vision. We will need to keep the vision in front of us: **CALLED TO BE DISCIPLES**. I believe God is saying to us what he said to Abraham: "if you can see it then I can do it. If you have a vision for it, then I can make it a way. I can open new doors. I can break the chains that are holding you back." If we embrace this vision and maintain our focus on it God will help us make it a reality.
