Friars

On behalf of the friars and staff, I want to wish all a very blessed and happy New Year!

As we look forward to the year ahead I welcome our new Parish Council. I met recently with the Chair of the Parish Council to discuss plans for the parish in 2019.

We discussed the development of a five year strategic plan, a weekend retreat and planning session for the Parish Council, preparation for the April visit by the Franciscan Holy Name Province evaluation team, and working with the staff to develop new programs to further bring the parish together and enhance the spiritual life of the parish.

One of the programs that I would like to see "get off the ground" is the weekend family retreat. These were very successful when I was pastor in the late 1990's. We tried to reinstitute the program last year but for a number of reasons had to cancel at the last minute. Hopefully we can work things out this coming year.

As I mentioned recently we will, for the first time, have a licensed psychological counselor available on parish grounds, one day a week beginning in January. This is a service provided by Catholic Charities.

I am pleased to also announce that our parish school has qualified for potential National Blue Ribbon Status. We have submitted the required documentation and should hear something in the next few months.

Mentioning the school, we will be initiating a 4 year old all-day Preschool program in the Fall. It has come to our attention that there is a significant demand for such a program.

Finally I will ask the Parish Council and Finance Committee to investigate the possibility of a Capital Campaign to make possible the expansion of parish meeting space. Currently, we are stretched very thin and often find it difficult to accommodate the many parish organizations and ministries.

All in all it looks to be a busy year ahead!
