Two weeks ago the national news described a funeral Mass, in which a Catholic priest at the funeral of a young man who committed suicide in the Midwest, suggested that the young man has committed a serious sin and might not be allowed entrance to heaven.

That priest made a serious mistake and fortunately has been suspended from preaching at funerals and directed to get counseling.

So what is the Church teaching on suicide?

Indeed for years the Church spoke of suicide as a sin, the taking of one's life. However with the advent of modern psychology the Church now realizes that when one takes their own life there are serious mitigating factors such as the inability to think clearly or make an objective conscious decision, or give clear consent of the will.

Consequently, we do not speak of suicide as a sin but as the ultimate tragedy that it is. A person who has been so overwhelmed by the darkness of depression, and anxiety, a person so exhausted mentally, that they make a decision that is neither rational nor deliberate.

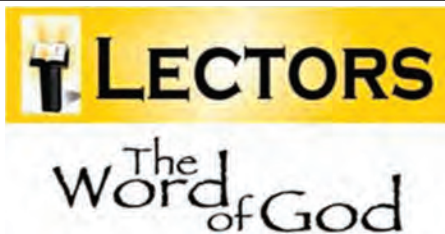
We talk not about this person being barred from heaven, but rather of this person now being embraced by a loving compassionate God.

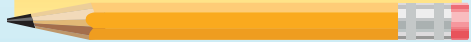

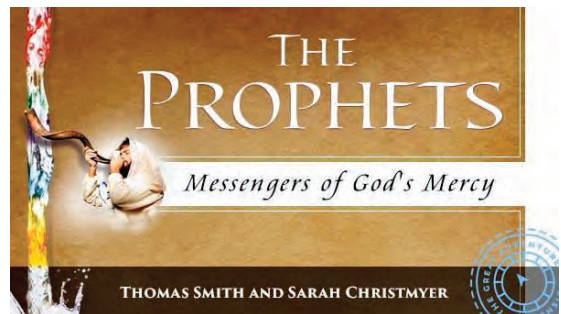

A fresh perspective on the Sunday Readings
HIS WORD TODAY
By Rev. William J. Reilly



"Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart will throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you...all from Sheba shall come, bringing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord...Then they spread their treasures and offered him gifts of gold frankincense and myrrh."

The season of holiday visiting is drawing to a close. Lights still shine, the manger scene is special today, and unwrapped gifts are still to be seen. The memories of visits, carols and delicious traditional foods are still fresh and happy. But what happens now?

Like the magi we have waited, searched and found the Christ. It is our turn to bring gifts, not the three mentioned in Isaiah and Matthew, but a more precious gift, a more valued gift, the one that the Lord Jesus is waiting to receive from us. It is the gift of ourselves.

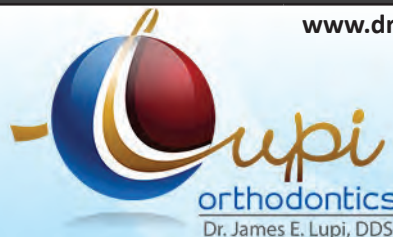
